

Tennessee Pulse Survey

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BACKGROUND



- Partnership between the Governor Bill Lee's Economic Recovery Group, The Howard H.
 Baker Jr. Center for Public Policy, and Social Work Office of Research and Public Service at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.
- Statewide web-based survey of +1,000 Tennesseans <u>each</u> wave enabling statistically valid segmentation by age, race, gender and region (89 county grouping and 6 county metro grouping).
- Six survey waves have been completed and are available on the Center's <u>CORE-19</u> website as well as a time-series comparison. Data collection for Wave 7 was just completed and will be posted to the website once the information has been processed.
- Provides data on Tennessean's attitudes toward re-opening of the economy to help guide public policy.

KEY FINDINGS



- A majority of Tennesseans are extremely or very concerned about the spread of COVID-19, only 9% are less concerned than 2 weeks ago.
- Tennesseans are most concerned about the health of their family over their own health, employment, or paying bills.
- Most report taking steps to protect themselves, including staying at home when ill (82%) and wearing masks (85%), with 88% reporting that masks work.
- Reports of mask wearing during various activities has increased over the last few months.
- Tennesseans want businesses to take steps to protect customers and employees from the spread of the virus, with more than 70% expressing concern that easing restrictions will lead to an increase in caseloads.
- About half are most concerned about the economy and about half are most concerned about the health impact of COVID-19.
- Attitudes have **largely been stable over time**, but there is **evidence of declining optimism since the summer** (*Looking ahead, two weeks from now...*), potentially driven by rising caseloads.

STEPS THAT AN **OVERWHELMING MAJORITY OF** TENNESSEANS REPORT TAKING TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE VIRUS:

WEARING MASKS OR FACE COVERINGS IN PUBLIC (85%)

STAYING HOME IF FEELING ILL (82%)


PRACTICING SOCIAL DISTANCING IN PUBLIC (77%)

WASHING OR SANITIZING HANDS IN PUBLIC (76%)


STEPS THAT MORE THAN HALF OF CONSUMERS WANT BUSINESSES AND EMPLOYEES TO TAKE:

•	Require employees to wear face coverings	(69%)
•	Provide wipes and/or sanitizer	(68%)
•	Screen employees for symptoms	(63%)
•	Frequently clean workplace	(62%)
•	Enforce social distancing	(62%)
•	Limit number of patrons	(56%)
•	Install plastic barriers	(51%)
•	Allow remote work when possible	(52%)



Q38e: If a vaccine that protected you from the coronavirus was available for free, would you...?




